

## RALLIES ON VIETNAM PLANNED IN CAPITAL

WASHINGTON, Oct. 19 — Details of prowar and antiwar demonstrations next week in Washington were announced by two groups here Tuesday.

Rennie Davis, spokesman for the People's Coalition for Peace and Justice, said that a "verbal agreement" had been reached with Justice Department officials for antiwar protests next Monday, including a gathering at the Sylvan Theater on the Mall and a candlelight march around the White House.

Mr. Davis said that plans for an early morning demonstration to "surround and shut down" the White House next Tuesday had been changed to a noon-time assembly. He said the Government would not grant a permit for the Tuesday gathering.

The Rev. Carl McIntire, the radio evangelist announced a "March for Victory" for Saturday. He predicted that several thousand people would gather on the Washington Monument grounds before a march starting at noon down Pennsylvania Avenue to a rally at the Capitol.
