

41 Are Held for Blocking Driveway at White House

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12 —

The police arrested 41 antiwar demonstrators today for blocking a White House driveway on the fifth day of a protest against continued American bombing in Indochina.

The demonstrators, most of whom came from Pittsburgh and Cleveland, had a permit to lie on the Pennsylvania Avenue sidewalk outside the White

House, but were prohibited entrance.

After meeting with Congressmen in the morning, the group marched from the Capitol to the White House. While some 20 lay on the sidewalk after being refused entry to the White House, most of the group stretched out in the driveway. A United States park police officer warned them that they would be arrested. When they remained where they were, the police closed off the sidewalk and arrested those in the driveway. Bail was set at \$50.
