Report by Jeff Kamen from Chicago:

The Chicago Daily News reports tonight, in its final edition and in an exclusive copyrighted article, that for more than six months federal agents have been tracking the man believed responsible for placing bombs in Chicago and New York banks. The FBI told the Chicago Daily News, the article says, that the FBI believes the bomber may be one of many radicals being sought by its agents on a variety of charges. The Chicago Daily News reports that those radicals include Mark Rudd, William Ayres (phonetic) and Howard Nofzinger, all of SDS, all of the Weatherman faction of SDS, says the Chicago Daily News. The Daily News says that federal agents say that they believe that the name Christopher C. Mohr which was used by a man who rented safety deposit boxes at three banks in Chicago and apparently placed bombs in each, was an alias used by one of the radicals. Federal experts on the underground movement, according to the Chicago Daily News, were showing FBI photos of radicals to employes of the three banks in Chicago in an attempt to learn the bomber's identity.

*Bomb in box at Bank of America, San Francisco, exploded 7 Sep 71 - four months ago. Box was rented in January 1971. Mohr made last visit to box 16 Jul 71 - six months and one week ago.

Marshall Schwartz, SFChronicle & Jan 72: Mohr has been the subject of FBI search for several months; Mohr manager of apartment house, where Mohr rented an apartment Dec 70, says he was questioned by FBI agents as long as six months ago.

Boxes in Chicago were rented in Dec 70; those in New York and San Francisco were rented in Jan 71.
