Agents first became interested in "Mohr" and the free-flat building on Arlington after a bomb exploded in a Bank of America safe deposit box in San Francisco on Sept. 7. The name and address were teh same.

Physicist

Agents of the Alcohol, Tax and Firearms Division of the U.S. Treasury Department routinely questioned residents of the building and neighbors. They learned little.

They did learn that a 28 year old "physicist" had rented the apartment in December, 1970, and lived there for a few days. He left owing rent.

The man was described as Christopher Charles Mohr having crew-cut hair, wearing Ivy League clothes and "seemingly a nice guy," by Dan Madori, former manager of the building.

Mail for Mohr arrived at the building from banks, presumably bills for the safe deposit boxes being leased under that name. They were either returned to the post office or thrown out.
