**An Anti-War  
Trip for Head  
Of Stanford**

President Richard W. Lyman of Stanford University flew to Washington yesterday to lobby in Congress against the Vietnam war, which he called "immoral at worst, a failure at best."

Lyman said he will try to "counter any tendency to write off recent campus protests as the work of a small, irrelevant minority."

He spoke briefly with Stanford students who have collected 15,000 signatures supporting a bill in Congress that would halt financing of the war.

Meanwhile, 50 employees of the Stanford Linear Accelerator Center picketed peacefully at the center yesterday to protest the war.

At nearby Santa Clara University yesterday, about 120 students joined in a peaceful march from their campus to the production headquarters of FMC Corp. on Coleman avenue near

Highway 17 in San Jose.

The students carried a casket wrapped in an American flag and staged a brief sit-in on the steps of the firm, whose manufactures include war materials, then returned to campus. There were no incidents.
