**A Concrete
Protest at
Arms Plant**

Five persons identified by police as anti-war activists, were arrested early yesterday for allegedly pouring cement into a railroad switch at an armaments plant.

State police said the five New Jersey residents, who identified themselves as members of "East Coast Conspiracy to Save Lives", had just finished pouring the cement and were placing a plastic-covered message in it when they were arrested.

The suspects, who were held at the York county prison in lieu of \$25,000 bail each, were identified as Roland Kirk, 25, and his sister, Patricia, 26, both of Princeton, N.J.; Eugene Galvin, 23, of Newark, N.J.; Thomas Korkames, 21, of New Brunswick, N.J.; and Monica McKig, 25, a Princeton theology student.

The plant was the scene of anti-war demonstrations and disruption of bomb shipments last spring during the "Harrisburg seven" trial.
