

3 Anti-War Marches on January 20

There will probably be not one, but three demonstrations against the Vietnam war January 20, and you can take your pick of solutions in choosing which one, if any, to attend.

The Northern California Peace Action Coalition will stand by their long-time demand "Out Now" in Civic Center.

The Students for a Democratic Society will hammer in Union Square at their theme of stopping "U.S. Government racism and genocide."

And at Dolores Park, the Inauguration Day Committee, a coalition of Berkeley peace groups, will demonstrate in favor of a conclusion to the war based on the nine-point agreement reached and then muddled in Paris last year.

While it appeared remotely possible, it was considered unlikely that the three groups could join in one massive demonstration of the type seen in the late '60s.

The Peace Action Coalition is recognized by all to be the most experienced and efficient at putting big demonstrations together — but they insist that the demonstration theme on their long-standing demand for the United States to get out of Southeast Asia now.

Their march begins at 11 a.m. at Market street and the Embarcadero followed by a rally at 1 p.m. in Civic Center. The SDS march begins at 9:30 a.m. at Fulton and Scott streets with the noon rally in Union Square followed by a conference and workshop sessions Sunday, January 21, in Pauley Ballroom at UC Berkeley. The Inauguration Day Committee begins marching from Garfield Square at 10 a.m. with a noon rally in Dolores Park.
