Informer Testifies To Kent State Jury

CLEVELAND — Terrence Norman, a Washington, D.C., policeman and former FBI campus informer, yesterday went before a federal grand jury probing the 1970 Kent State University shootings.

The 23-member panel is hearing evidence to determine whether crimes were committed during the May 4 confrontation of antiwar demonstrators and members of the Ohio National Guard during which four Kent State students were killed and nine others wounded on the campus.

Norman, who recently joined the Washington police force, posed as a photographer while serving as an undercover agent during the Kent State incident. Immediately after the shootings he turned over a gun he was carrying to campus policemen. Thomas Kelly and Harold Rice.

There have been reports, which he and campus police officers have denied, that Norman fired a shot.
