

Student at Kent Regarded Shots as 'Planned Murder'

CLEVELAND, June 23 (UPI) —A former student who was shot by Ohio National Guardsmen at Kent State University on May 4, 1970, testified today that at the time of the shootings "I thought it was planned murder."

Alan Canfora of Barberton, Ohio, testified in United States District Court here at the opening of the sixth week of the \$48-million civil suit filed by the parents of the four students killed and nine wounded by guardsmen during an antiwar demonstration.

Mr. Canfora, who shot in the wrist, was asked by defense counsel during cross examination if he told that to the Federal Bureau of Investigation during an investigation of the shootings five years ago. He said, "Yes."

He was asked then to explain his reasoning and said, "from my vantage point, I saw a small group of guardsmen out of the entire group, turn and fire into a crowd of college students. I didn't think that happened by accident."
