

2 POINTS CLARIFIED FOR KENT STATE JURY

CLEVELAND, Aug. 26 (UPI)
—Jurors in the \$46-million Kent State University civil trial found today two more errors in the wording of the 76-page instruction given them by Federal District Judge Don J. Young.

The jury questioned portions of the charge dealing with nine Ohio National Guard officers, and a part concerning 17 former enlisted guardsmen who are defendants in the case.

Yesterday the jurors questioned part of the charge concerning Gov. James A. Rhodes of Ohio.

Judge Young had set out multiple-choice questions the jury was to consider in determining whether defendants were liable for damages because of the incident on May 4, 1970, when four students were killed and nine wounded by guardsmen during an antiwar protest.

The jurors' confusion arose because, in each case, one question was worded so as to call for a "no" answer while the others called for "yes" answers.

Judge Young reworded the confusing portions and the jurors returned to deliberations. They adjourned for the day shortly before 6 P.M.
