

No Secret

Deals on

Indochina

 SAIGON — UPI — Special U.S. Envoy Marshall Green told President Nguyen Van Thieu today that President Nixon held no secret meetings with North Vietnam and made no secret deals on Indochina during his Peking visit.

Green, an assistant secretary of state who travelled with Nixon and now is on a 13-nation Far East tour to explain the results of the visit to U.S. Allies, met with Thieu for two hours at Independence Palace.

A Foreign Office communique said Green gave Thieu a personal letter from Nixon and then reported to him on the visit and the joint U.S.-China communique issued afterward.

"Ambassador Green affirmed that during the visit President Nixon did not hold any secret meeting with North Vietnam in any form or through any person," that communique said.

"Ambassador Green also gave assurances that there was no secret agreement with Red China on Vietnam."

The Foreign Office said Green reaffirmed the United States' intention to "respect all its commitments to all nations," and presented the viewpoints of Asian leaders with whom he has already met.
