WASHINGTON, May 10—Senior Soviet naval officers, who are in Washington to negotiate arrangements under which the United States and Russia would seek to avoid provocative incidents at sea, were invited Monday night to the home of the chief American negotiator, Secretary of the Navy John W. Warner.
