## **Justice** Clark-a **Proud Dad**

War Views Like Ramsey's

Everywhere he went - in the crowded lobby of the San Francisco Hilton where he is staying and out in the street - retired U.S. Supreme Court Justice Tom C. Clark found himself being greeted by friends and total strangers yesterday.

His friends and admirers, who had no trouble spotting the tall, erect, gray-haired justice, invariably said something about his son, former U.S. Attorney General Ramsey Clark.

"Almost all the comment is favorable," Clark said with a smile as he took time out from shaking hands with people who wanted to talk

about Ramsey.

Hanoi Trip

He was referring to comment on his son's journey to Hanoi and what Ramsey Clark had to say about the U.S. bombing of North Vietnam when he arrived for the American Bar Association convention at the Hilton.

we've hit dikes and canals. Our bombers are killing little babies, women and old men. It's not only inhumane but stupid.")

Justice Clark said he had not yet seen his son for a talk about his experiences in North Vietnam.

'Catch Him Later'

"I expect to catch up with him later," said the elder Clark. "I understand he's been pretty busy since he held his press conference at the St. Francis.

"I didn't know Ramsey was going to Hanoi. He didn't tell me and I didn't see him before he left."

Asked how he feels about his son's statements following the trip to North Vietnam, Clark said:

"Ramsey is a very careful and deliberate lawyer. I have every confidence in him and I am proud of him."

Justice Clark said he has never publicly stated his views on the Vietnam war.

Quick Reply

Asked what those views are, he replied unhesitating-

"I'd say they are pretty much like Ramsey's."

While Justice Clark was expressing agreement with his son in an interview away from the mainstream of pedestrian traffic in the Hilton lobby, two women spotted him and came rushing over.
