## Cambodian Post Seized

Phnom Penh

Two hundred Cambodian government soldiers, defending a Mekong river bank position 12 miles northeast of the capital, were forced to abandon the post yesterday after a three-hour-long fight with Communist attackers, a field report said.

Government commanders said that 30 of their men were killed, another 30 miss-

ing and the others escaped 20 miles south of Phnom to safety by swimming the Penh. The cuts isolated sev-Mekong to the west bank.
