Hanoi Blames U.S. For Sonic Booms

A double supersonic boom shook this city's downtown section, rattling window panes and doors yesterday.

A spokesman for the North Vietnamese Foriegn Ministry said the boom was caused by the jet engines of an SR-71 American reconnaissance plane.

The SR-71, which has replaced the U-2 reconnaissance plane, flies at an altitude of about 75,000 feet, beyond the reach of antiaircraft weapons.

The spokesman stressed that the incident represented a new violation of Article 2 of the Paris peace agreements and of the first line of the joint American-Vietnamese communique signed June 13.
