**A Liberal Party Leader
Pleads Guilty in Disorder**

ROCHESTER, Sept. 6 (UPI)—
Raphael Martinez, chairman of
the Monroe County Liberal
party, entered a guilty plea to-
day in State Supreme Court
here to charges stemming from
a disturbance on the Hobart
College campus in June, 1970.
He pleaded guilty to three
counts of disorderly conduct
and one count of harassment.

Five other persons also
charged in connection with the
disturbance entered guilty pleas
last December after a jury
failed to reach a decision on
their case.

Mr. Martinez said he "could
no longer afford to continue
the court battle."

In the disturbance, militant
students claimed that a po-
lice undercover agent, Thomas
(Tommy the Traveler) Tongyai,
had taught them how to make
fire bombs.
