F.B.I. Presses Hunt In Slaying of Dr. King

WASHINGTON, April 21
UPI)—The Federal Bureau of Investigation said today that it was hunting the assassin of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. with "all possible vigor," but that there was nothing new to report. The manhunt is in its 17th day.

The accused assassin, James Earl Ray has been placed on the bureau's roster of most wanted criminals, and a special alert has been ordered along the Mexican border.

J. Edgar Hoover, the F.B.I. director, put Ray, alias Eric Starvo Galt, on the most-wanted list to insure the widest possible dissemination of the 40-year-old escaped convict's picture and description to the police and public.
