No New Clues on King Slayer

Washington

The FBI said yesterday it was hunting the assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King with "all possible vigor," but that there was nothing new to report in the Nation's largest manhunt—now in its 17th day.

With prison escaper James Earl Ray given an extraordinary emergency listing on the FBI's roster of most wanted criminals, a special alert was ordered along the Mexican border to prevent him from leaving the country.

But the FBI, which is directing the massive search, had nothing new to report since Saturday, when it made Ray—alias Eric Starvo Galt—the 11th man on its ten most wanted list.

FBI director J. Edgar Hoover put Ray on the most-wanted list to insure the wildest possible dissemination of the 40-year-old criminal's picture and description.

The FBI said he should be

considered armed and dangerous.

He was described as:

• About 5 feet 10 inches tall and weighing between 163 and 174 pounds; blue eyes and brown hair frequently

cropped short; a neat dresser.

• A fan of western music who likes vodka and beer; a 1968 graduate of a Los Angeles bartending school.
