Hall said Bradley was present at the meeting in Los Angeles in 1953, where Hall was the guest speaker. He said he talked to Bradley who questioned him about his contacts in the anti-Castro

Bradley yesterday denied that he ever had met Hall or

talked to him.

Hall said the meeting at which he was a speaker took place in the home of a man he identified as "C. C. Wheat" at 233 S. Lafayette Park Place.

Local records indicate the house was occupied by a "G. Clinton Wheat" at "that time.

'FBI AGENTS'

Bradley said he attended a lecture on communism given by an FBI agent at Wheat's house in "early" 1963, and later that year was a guest speaker at another meeting there.

A "Clinton Wheat" headed California chapter of an organization known as the Committee of One Million Caucasians to march on Washington in 1964," in

which national Ku Klux Klan officials were involved.

Hall said another guest at his lecture was Col. William P. Gale, described by the Attorney General's office as head of the right-wing California Rangers.

Hall also told of a tape recording he said was made in Miami, Fla., on Nov. 9, 1963. during a meeting of a "bunch of states righters."

RECORDING

One of the voices on the re-cording said the group had a man selected to kill Kennedy and another to be the "patsy," Hall asserted.

Voices on the recording, according to Hall, said "The same person has been gunning for Martin Luther King."

Hall denied that he ever knew James Earl Ray, also known as Eric Starvo Galt, named by the FBI as prime suspect in King's slaying.
