2nd Arrest Seen in King Case

CHICAGO — A second person may be arrested in the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King during the next two weeks, an author writing an account of "the plot" to kill the civil rights leaders said.

William Bradford Huie who has purchased the rights to accused assassin James Earl Ray's story, made the prediction on a weekend TV talk show.

"It wouldn't surprise me if there were another arrest before the trial begins," Huie said on a Chicago TV show.

Ray, an escaped convict, has been charged with killing King. He is the only person arrested in the killing and is scheduled to stand trial beginning Nov. 12.

Huie hinted that there was a conspiracy behind King's death.

He said the first of two articles he has written for Look magazine will deal with "the plot to assassinate Martin Luther King."

REVELATIONS

The first, which will be published tomorrow, tells "how the plot began," while the second tells "how it worked," Huie said.

Huie says he knows who some of the persons involved in the alleged plot are but does not name them in the articles because this information will come out during Ray's trial.
