

### Canadian Travel Man Faces Trial in Ray Passport Case

OTTAWA, Nov. 4 (Canadian Press)—The manager of the Toronto travel agency, which unwittingly helped James Earl Ray get a Canadian passport, is facing prosecution for violation of affidavit procedure, the House of Commons was told today.

Justice Minister John Turner said Henry Moos, manager of the Kennedy Travel Bureau, was to his knowledge the only Canadian charged in connection with the case against Ray, who is charged with the assassination of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

"Nothing has been placed before me that would warrant criminal proceedings against any other person arising out of dealings with James Earl Ray," Mr. Turner said.
