

LOOK'S RAY ARTICLE SCORED BY LAWYERS

MEMPHIS, Nov. 4 (AP) — A committee of lawyers said Monday that William Bradford Huie, the author, and the publishers of Look magazine could be in contempt of court because of an article on James Earl Ray in the current issue of Look.

The committee, named to watch over pretrial publicity in the case of Ray, charged with murder in the assassination of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., made its report to Judge W. Preston Battles of Criminal Court.

It said that Mr. Huie, by writing the article, and Cowles Publications, by publishing the article in Look, probably violated the judge's order restricting pretrial publicity.

The article tells of Ray's activities following his escape from the Missouri state prison and before Dr. King's slaying in Memphis April 4. It was the first of a series.

OTTAWA, Nov. 4 (Canadian Press)—The manager of the Toronto travel agency that unwittingly helped James Earl Ray get a Canadian passport, is facing prosecution for violation of affidavit procedure, the House of Commons was told Monday.

Justice Minister John Turner said Henry Moos, manager of the Kennedy Travel Bureau, was to his knowledge the only Canadian charged in connection with the case against Ray, who is charged with the assassination of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.
