Review by Perry Adams of "To Kill a Black Man," by Louis Lomax.

Reviewer says book is "more than an examination of the assassinations of Malcolm X and Martin Luther King, Jr..."

"The extent to which America and its government will go to maintain racism was shown after Malcolm X 'forged a major link with Middle East and African revolutionaries.' Then the CIA began to watch him. Malcolm returned to America from Africa to rally American blacks to pressure the American government to stop CIA interference in Algeria and Ghana. Both countries at this time were being attacked by the American State Department. Malcolm was considered a major threat to American foreign policy. Lomax states that the evidence indicates that the CIA 'was deeply involved in Malcolm's death.' It should also be noted that Lomax thinks that King's death was related to both of the Kennedys'."
