30 -- Huie claims Ray had been highly political since 1952, a racist who worked for Wallace in California. It was difficult to find ~~this~~ this out about him, he concealed it in his correspondence with Huie. I didn't know when I wrote my first two LOOK articles about him. It didn't come out until he got his last attorney, Percy Foreman, who cooperated with me.

Was there a conspiracy? In my first two pieces I believed other persons than Ray made the decision to kill Dr. King.

I now doubt this and believe that Ray decided on it himself. I don't know whether he had assistance in planning the killing.

-- Fensterwald -- thinks Huie is having a terrible time digesting his first two LOOK articles.

Why Garrison failed: Several witnesses changed their testimony, Dean Andrews for one. Bethell admits having sold out to the other side.

The autopsy -- the 1968 panel reported metal fragments in the ~~brain~~ neck, which would have had to come from the magic bullet.

Hoove at first saw a conspiracy in the King murder, but soon switched to the official line.

I find most people feel the Warren Report is false. What they don't want to hear is what really happened, they seem to be afraid to learn the truth because it might be too terrible.
