

## Rev. King's Kin Found Dead

ATLANTA — (AP) — The Rev. A. D. King, 38, only brother of slain Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., was found dead today in the swimming pool of his Atlanta home, an associate said.

King came home late last night and went for a swim in his backyard pool. His body was found this morning by three of his children, said the Rev. Andrew Young.

Cause of death was not learned immediately.

Young is executive vice president of Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), of which A. D. King was a director.

It was little more than 15 months ago that the older brother was shot to death by a sniper.

King moved to Atlanta and became copastor of Ebenezer Baptist church with his father, following the assassination. King had been active in the civil rights movement in Louisville, Ky., leading open housing demonstrations, and in Birmingham, Ala., during a seige of 1963 demonstrations in which his home was bombed.

An SCLC spokesman said Mrs. King and their two youngest children were in Jamaica, with Coretta Scott King, widow of Dr. King.
