

Rev. A. D. King's Autopsy Results

The Fulton county medical examiner, Dr. Tom Dillon, reported yesterday that tests showed the Rev. A. D. King, who drowned

last week, was drinking just before his death.

The 38-year-old brother of the late Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., was found clad in his underwear in a pool at

his home July 21.

Dillon said in an official report a blood sample examination by the state crime lab showed a 0.27 per cent alcohol content, nearly three

times the amount needed for a drunken driving conviction.

The cause of death was accidental drowning, medical examiner said.
