A. D. King Autopsy Finding

ATLANTA, July 29 (AP)—The Fulton County medical examiners Dr. Tom Dillon, reported on Tuesday tests had shown that the Rev. A. D. King, who drowned last week, was drinking at the time of his death. The brother of the late Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was found clad in his underwear in a pool at his home July 21. Dr. Dillon said in an official report a blood sample examination by the state crime lab showed a 0.27 per cent alcohol content, nearly three times the amount needed for a drunken driving conviction in Georgia. The cause of death was accidental drowning, he said.
