

**CBS Seeks Ballistic Data
On the Slaying of Dr. King**

MEMPHIS, Sept. 24 (UPI)—
CBS, Inc. has requested access
to ballistics evidence in the
1968 slaying of Dr. Martin Lu-
ther King Jr. and a hearing has
been scheduled Friday on the
petition. 26 SEP

A Memphis attorney, New-
ton P. Allen, representing the
network, asked the court to let
CBS newsmen and experts ex-
amine a 30.06 rifle, a cartridge
case, a slug, a cartridge box
and a windowsill now in court
custody.

Mr. Allen contends that a
CBS program on the King as
sassinaton and others, sched-
uled for television broadcast
Nov. 30, could "have a bearing
on the important question of
the existence of a conspiracy
which is also of continuing pub-
lic interest."
