**Lawyer Says He Thinks Ray
'Covering Up for Someone'**

MEMPHIS, June 9 (AP)—One of James Earl Ray's attorneys said Thursday that he was convinced his client was not acting alone in the 1968 slaying of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Robert I. Livingston said that Mr. Ray's only hope for freedom from a 99-year prison sentence was to tell all and hope for executive clemency.

"I'm convinced he's covering up for someone," Mr. Livingston said in a telephone interview.
