

Ray Quizzed Again

James Earl Ray, serving a 99-year sentence for killing Martin Luther King Jr., was questioned for a third time here yesterday by U.S. House assassinations committee investigators.

Robert Lehner, head of the committee probers, refused to talk afterwards with reporters. Ray was questioned by Lehner and other committee investigators twice last month at the prison here.

Richard Sprague, who resigned two weeks ago as the committee's chief counsel, said earlier this week that Ray told investigators three persons helped him before and after the assassination.
