

## 2 SENATORS ACCUSED BY 3D IN I.T.T. INQUIRY

WASHINGTON, March 12 (AP)—Senator Marlow W. Cook, Republican of Kentucky, said today that he believed Democratic Senators Edward Kennedy and Birch Bayh and Jack Anderson, the columnist, had conspired to “discredit Government officials despite the absence of wrongdoing of any kind” in the International Telephone and Telephone Corporation merger case.

Senator Cook released a letter asking Senator James O. Eastland, Democrat of Mississippi who is chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee, to call a closed committee meeting to consider his accusation.

Mr. Cook said Brit Hume, an assistant to Mr. Anderson, had made material available to Mr. Kennedy and the Massachusetts Senator had refused to give this to the committee.

Senator Kennedy said in response: “I hope that each member of the committee has instructed his staff, as I have, to develop every relevant piece of information, and that none of them will be deterred by the diversionary efforts to those who would rather not see this investigation proceed.”
