WASHINGTON — (UPI)

—After days of wrangling, a special Senate subcommittee decided today to take testimony in a Denver hospital early next week from a key witness in the International Telephone and Telegraph case.

Sen. Philip Hart (D-Mich), chairman of the seven-man unit of the Senate Judiciary Committee, said the interrogation of Washington lobbyist Dita Beard, hospitalized with a heart ailment, will take place Sunday, Monday and Tuesday.

The subcommittee originally intended to go to Denver last week, but got sidetracked with other senate business which also disrupted public hearings in the Judiciary Committee's investigation.

A spokesman said the full committee would hold no further hearings in the case until the subcommittee returns from Denver. That would mean the earliest they could resume would be March 29.
