The memo, attributed to her and published by columnist Jack Anderson, linked the dropping of an antitrust suit against ITT to a donation by that corporation to President Nixon's reelection campaign.

Mrs. Beard, who gave Time correspondent Ted Hall a long, colorful account of her life, said her job with ITT WAS "beautiful until those sons of bitches pulled this one on me."

Hall said she was apparently referring to Anderson and his associate, Brit Hume, who interviewed her about the memo.
