Report on

'Affair'

SANTIAGO (Chile) — (UPI) — President Salvador Allende will go on nationwide radio and television next week to tell the nation about the "ITT affair," government sources said today.

The government, meanwhile, announced that "official translations" were being prepared of documents released by columnist Jack Anderson, accusing the International Telephone and Telegraph Corp. of seeking to prevent Allende's inauguration.

The President will address the nation "so that the country will have complete understanding of such an important and delicate matter," government sources said.

According to the government statement, the "official translations" of the Anderson documents were being made because "public opinion knows of the existence of such documents, but does not have an exact idea of their contents, because some journalistic organs have either given distorted versions of them or have simply chosen to ignore them."
