THE CLAIM BY OFFICIALS OF INTERNATIONAL TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH
CORP. THAT THEY NEVER SAW THE ALLEGED DITA BEARD MEMORANDUM WAS
DISPUTED IN SAN DIEGO MORE THAN A MONTH AGO BY U.S. REP. BOB

WILSON, R-SAN DIEGO MOKE THAN A MONTH AGO BY SOME WITH THE SAN DIEGO CONGRESSMAN, IN A MARCH 3 INTERVIEW WITH THE SAN DIEGO UNION, MADE SEVERAL POINTS ABOUT MATTERS RELATING TO THE SENATE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE'S INVESTIGATION INTO ALLEGATIONS THAT A DEAL WAS MADE BETWEEN THE ITT AND THE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT.

SOME OF THE POINTS, INCLUDING ONE RELATING TO THE EXISTENCE OF A MEMORANDUM, DID NOT MATCH UP WITH THE TESTIMONY LATER GIVEN TO THE COMMITTEE, WHICH RESUMES ITS HEARINGS IN WASHINGTON TODAY. (THURS)

COMMITTEE, WHICH RESUMES 115
AMONG WILSON'S STATEMENTS:

--MRS. DITA BEARD, THE ITT LOBBYIST WHO ALLEGEDLY WROTE A MEMO LINKING AN OUT-OF-COURT ANTITRUST SUIT TO AN ITT UNDERWRITING OF THE REPUBLICAN NATIONAL CONVENTION, TOLD WILSON SHE HAD TYPED A MEMORANDUM RELATING TO THE ISSUE, AND PERSONALLY CARRIED IT TO HER BOSS, WILLIAM R.

-MERRIAM, HEAD OF ITT'S WASHINGTON OFFICE, TOLD WILSON THAT HE HAD RECEIVED THE MEMO, BUT THOUGHT HE HAD GIVEN IT BACK TO MRS.

BEARD.

--HAROLD GENEEN, PRESIDENT OF ITT, HAD CONFIRMED TO WILSON AT A DINNER IN SAN DIEGO LAST MAY 12, THAT HIS ORGANIZATION WOULD UNDERWRITE \$400,000 OF SAN DIEGO'S CASH BID TO GET THE 1972 REPUBLICAN NATIONAL CONVENTION.

ALL THREE POINTS SINCE HAVE BEEN DENIED -- FULLY OR PARTIALLY -- IN TESTIMONY OR STATEMENTS GIVEN TO THE COMMITTEE. THE COMMITTEE IS INVESTIGATING CHARGES ARISING FROM THE MEMO THAT A DEAL EXISTED

BETWEEN ITT AND THE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT, AND WHETHER ATTY.

GEN. -NOM INEE RICHARD G. KLEINDIENST WAS INVOLVED IN ANY WRONG DOING.

MRS. BEARD, TESTIFYING TO THE COMMITTEE IN DENVER, SAID SHE HAD NEVER
WRITTEN THE MEMO AS IT APPEARED IN JACK ANDERSON SCOLUMN FEB. 29. SHE
SAID SHE REMEMBERED PORTIONS OF IT, BUT NOT THOSE IN WHICH SHE
LINKED THE ITT CONVENTION UNDERWRITING TO THE OUT-OF-COURT ANTITRUST SETTLEMENTS.

WILSON, IN THE INTERVIEW MARCH 3, DID NOT MENTION WHETHER MRS.
BEARD DISPUTED THE ANDERSON MEMO. HE SAID SHE HAD TOLD HIM SHE
TYPED UP THE MEMO AT MERRIAM'S REQUEST TO CLARIFY AN AGREEMENT
MADE BETWEEN WILSON, GENEEN AND SHERATON CORP. OF AMERICA PRESIDENT
HOWARD (BUD) JAMES ABOUT ITT BACK OF THE CONVENTION CASH BID.
WILSON COULD NOT BE CONTACTED FOR COMMENT OR CLAIRFICATION.
MERRIAM, IN A SWORN STATEMENT, SAID "I DID NOT RECEIVE THIS
ALLEGED MEMORANDUM FROM MRS. BEARD ON JUNE 25, 1971, OR AT ANY

OTHER TIME.

IN THE MARCH 3 INTERVIEW, WILSON SAID MERRIAM HAD ORDERED MRS. BEARD—WHO WAS INVOLVED IN THE MAY 12 MEETING—TO PUT HER THOUGHTS IN A MEMO. WILSON SAID MRS. BEARD ASKED MERRIAM WHY HE WANTED IT IN WRITING, AND HE REPLIED "I DON'T UNDERSTAND THE RAMIFICATIONS."

SO. WILSON SAID, MRS. BEARD "HAND-CARRIED IT, SHE SAID, TO

MERRIAM ... "

AFTER ANDERSON MADE KNOWN HIS VERSION OF THE MEMO, WILSON SAID, MERRIAM CAME TO WILSON'S OFFICE. "AND HE SAID 'I DID GET THAT MEMO' BUT HE SAID 'I'M SURE I GAVE IT BACK TO DITA, "WILSON CONTINUED. MERRIAM, ACCORDING TO WILSON, CONTINUED BY SAYING MRS. BEARD HAD DISAGREED, AND THAT HE DID NOT KNOW WHAT HAD HAPPENED TO THE MEMO. "AND THEN WHAT HAPPENS?" WILSON ASKED. "ITT PUTS OUT THE STORY THAT NOBODY EVER SAW IT. WELL, THAT'S GARRITY (E.J. GARRITY, EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT TO GENEEN) SAYING NOBODY EVER SAW THE MEMO, "WILSON SAID." WILSON SAID.

THE HELL THEY DIDN'T. MERIAM PERSONALLY TOLD ME LAST MONDAY
THAT HE GOT THE MEMO...
IN THE INTERVIEW, WILSON ALSO CONFIRMED THAT HE. GENEEN AND JAMES—
THE PRESIDENT OF THE ITT HOTEL CHAIN SUBSIDIARY—HAD ARRANGED
DURING THE MAY 12 DINNER MEETING IN SAN DIEGO FOR THE \$400,000
UNDERWRITING.
