members Senator Dole said:
"I am sure you are aware through the news media that we are faced with problems in San Diego that are almost insurmountable. This has led us to consider the possibility of moving the convention to another site."

Mr. Dole said last week that if a shift was recommended, the committee "probably would ratify that change."

Republican troubles with the San Diego site have included difficulty in getting the San Diego Arena ready in time for the convention, the shortage of housing, and a delay in re-ceiving money pledged by a San Diego civic group.
