## More Wiretaps, Kleindienst Vows

Philadelphia [AP] - Richard G. Kleindienst, confirmed Thursday as United States Attorney General after lengthy Senate hearings, said yesterday that wiretapping "is a legitimate, constitutional means to root out organized crime" and he vowed to keep using it.

"This will be done while this President (Richard Nixon) is President and while I am attorney general,"
Kleindienst told the Philadelphia chapter of the Federal Bar Association.

In recent decision, federal judges have differed over the legality of electronic surveillance.

"Wiretapping is necessary to fight crime," Kleindienst said. "It is the only way to get evidence to convict."

Kleindienst will be sworn in Monday [12 Jun] in the White House four months after he was nominated by Mr. Nixon to head the Justice Department.
