

Eastland Urges Bolstering Of Internal Security Laws

WASHINGTON, April 5 (UPI) — Senator James O. Eastland, Democrat of Mississippi, introduced today a wide-ranging Internal Security Act and five other bills he said were needed urgently to bolster the nation's internal security laws.

The six-bill package has been designed to "restore efficacy and enforceability" to the Internal Security Act of 1950 and to plug loopholes suggested by various Supreme Court decisions, Mr. Eastland said.

Senator Eastland, chairman of the Internal Security Subcommittee of the Judiciary Committee, said the proposed Internal Security Act would increase the effectiveness of the Subversive Activities Control Board, "effectively prohibit" the employment of Communists as workers in defense facilities or as teachers in school systems supported wholly or in part by Federal funds, deny tax exemptions for subversive organizations or individuals and disallow tax deductions for donations to Communist organizations.
