Nixon Move On Secrecy Assailed

WASHINGTON — (AP) — President Nixon's executive order revamping document-secrecy rules prevents disclosure of "top secret" documents for 10 years the head of the House government information subcommittee said today.

The order itself fails to "live up to the laudable goals of the President's statement," said Rep. William S. Moorhead (D-Pa.).

This means, Moorhead added, that a President could safely stay in office for eight years and make it possible for "his vice president or another of his supporters to succeed him without the public knowing of the full details of a major defense or foreign policy error his administration had committed."
