members of Congress yesterday urged the House to send President Ford a formal request for an account of the freeing of the American merchant ship Mayaguez from her Cambodian captors.

The resolution of inquiry, if the House approves it, would be simply a request to the President, not a demand.

In a joint statement the group said, "the United States' reaction to the ship's seizure resulted in a number of combat casualties and left a great many questions as to the timing, nature and scope of the rescue operation.

"We believe that Congress should look closely at this incident, not only to clear up confusion as to what happened, but to evaluate the decidion-making process and to letermine how such situations might be handled better n the future."

The resolution would ask he President to tell the House what happened, what liplomatic contacts nade, to what extent he consulted members of Congress. what intelligence reports were ised for the military action hat recaptured the ship, and he extent of American intellience in Cambodia after the Communists' takeover there.
