

Different at Nuremberg

To the Editor:

It is probably correct to conclude that the prosecution and conviction of Lieutenant Calley are consistent with the broad principles laid down at the Nuremberg Trials. But it does seem to me very important to bear in mind that the accused persons at Nuremberg were not the Lieutenant Calleys. They were rather among the most responsible policy makers in Hitler's Germany.

It would therefore be correct to conclude also that under the principles laid down at Nuremberg the chief U.S. policy makers of the war against Vietnam should have been in the dock.
