

**Pentagon Delays Decision
On Releasing Mylai Report**

WASHINGTON, Dec. 24 (AP) — The Pentagon said today that a decision on whether to make public the full Army report of the Mylai killings would

be made after all legal appeals and reviews in the case were completed.

Jerry W. Freidheim, the Defense Department spokesman, said that this represented no change in the policy set forth by former Secretary of the Army Stanley R. Resor.

Mr. Freidheim's remarks were prompted by an article in The Los Angeles Times saying that the Army no longer considered itself bound to a promise by Resor in March, 1970, to release the full report on the killing of South Vietnamese civilians in 1968.
