

# Military Court Won't Reconsider on Calley

## Washington

The U.S. Court of Military Appeals yesterday declined to reconsider its earlier rejection of Lieutenant William L. Calley Jr.'s appeal from his conviction in the My Lai massacre case.

The court, the highest American military tribunal, upheld Calley's conviction and 20-year prison sentence December 21.

In refusing to hear new arguments in the case, the court sends the Calley case to Secretary of the Army Howard H. Callaway for his personal review.

Whatever Callaway elects to do, President Nixon has said he'll pass final review on Calley, convicted of the premeditated murder of no fewer than 22 Vietnamese civilians.
