

Nixon Plot Trio's Trial Postponed

NEW YORK — (UPI) — The trial of three Yemeni Arabs — father and two sons — for an alleged plot to assassinate President-elect Nixon has been put off at least four months and possibly longer it was learned today.

Court officials said the trial of Ahmed Rageh Namer, 43, and his two sons, Hussein, 20, and Abdo, 18, will be put on the court calendar for trial in late spring or early summer.

The district attorney's office had disclosed earlier this year it was "ready for trial" and was hoping the case would come up by March. There was no immediate explanation for the apparent delay in bringing the case to trial.

The three defendants, meanwhile, remained free on bail.
