MRS. MITCHELL SAID TO HAVE F.B.I. GUARD

President Nixon has ordered Federal Bureau of Investigation protection for Mrs. John N. Mitchell, wife of the Attorney General, but she believes that the families of Cabinet members would be safer living in a protected compound, it was reported yesterday.

In an interview with Mrs. Mitchell, published in the cur-rent issue of Look mgaazine, she is quoted as saying that the protected homes should be situated on the grounds of the National Arboretum, a large botanical garden in Washington.

"They have so many acres, they could spare some," she

said.

The article, according to United Press International, said United Press International, said that Mr. Nixon had ordered protection for Mrs. Mitchell and her 9-year-old daughter, Martha Jr., because "she receives threats so frightening" that even the daughter sometimes reminds her: "You know I can't go out alone. I might be kidnapped."
