uled. But she said Mrs. Stuart, in a Monday briefing announced that Mrs. Nixon would attend a Blair House luncheon "spon-sored by the Cabinet wives." "I haven't spoken to her since," Mrs. Mitchell said of Mrs Stuart

"This is the worst thing I've ever been through since I've been in Washington," she said with irritation.

At a press briefing two hours later, Mrs. Stuart said she had not talked to Mrs. Mitchell in months and had not known she was the host for the luncheon when she announced on Monday that Mrs. Nixon would at-tend.
