Soviet Crewman Fails In Bid to Defect at Sea

NEW BEDFORD, Mass., Nov. 24 (AP)-Three fishing industry men said today that officers of the Coast Guard cutter Vigilant refused to

cutter Vigilant refused to grant political asylum to a radio operator from a Soviet fishing ship off the Massachusetts coast.

The three said the crewman, an unidentified Lithuanian, jumped aboard the Vigilant about 4 P.M. yesterday and appealed for asylum, but, after negotiations that con-

tinued to nearly midnight, was returned to the Soviet ship by force.

The incident occurred as the Vigilant and the Soviet ship, identified only as a mother ship to a fishing fleet, were tied up alongside each other off Martha's Vineyard for a conference on fishing rights in the North Atlantic. In Washington, State Department officials said privately that they considered the incident to be "unfortunate,"
