Nixon Popularity Hits New Low

NEW YORK - President of college students who feel Nixon's campus popularity the President has done excelhas slipped considerably during the past year and now is at the lowest level with the college generation, the Col-lege Poll reveals.

Students on over 100 campuses were asked:

"How do you believe President Nixon has performed so far?"

The poll was taken before the November elections and included 1347 students.

This report is the latest of a series of trend studies on the President's collegiate popularity which started after his election in 1968.

A comparison with previous years indicates the stu-dents' attitude toward the President is one of steady er osion. The President's highest rating came just after his inauguration, when students adopted a "wait-and-see' attitude.

On the other hand, nearly 80 percent of the students give the President a "fair" or worse rating this fall, where only 50 percent voted in a like manner after the inauguration. It is also significant that 4 out of 10 students now rate the President's per-
