Mitchell Declares **Courts Overstress Rights of Accused**

WASHINGTON, June 9 (UPI) —Attorney General John N. Mitchell said today that the Administration was trying to restore fairness to the court-room, which he said had suf-fered because of "preoccupation with fairness for the accused." Mr. Mitchell said that the Administration would propose legislation to "make the court-room a place where fact is de-termined and innocence or guilt decided, rather than a place where fact is obscured and jus-tice frustrated through the tri-umph of sophistry over common sense." He said that the Administra-tion was already trying to re-store-courtroom balance through a greater use of wiretaps and increased financial assistance to state and local prosecutors. He did not elaborate on the proposed legislation but said that there was no intention of taking away any of the consti-tutional rights now afforded ac-

tutional rights now afforded ac-cused persons. "The preoccupation with fair-ness for the accused has done violence to fairness for the accuser," he said in a speech prepared for the National Dis-trict Attorney's Association. "Is justice served now by shackling the prosecutor and giving more weapons to the defense?" He said that he was refer

He said that he was refer-ring to "the overwhelming attention to proceduralism . . . almost all of it benefiting the accused."
