Kissinger 'Indisposed' In Pakistan

Rawalpindi

Presidential adviser of Henry Kissinger, feeling slightly ill, drove to a mountain resort in the hills of northern Pakistan yesterday.

Informed sources said Kissinger, on a global fact-finding tour, was "feeling slightly indisposed, however he will keep his essential engagements." They did not elaborate on his ailment.

Foreign secretary Sultan Mohammad Khan accompanied Kissinger to Nathiagali Hill Station, a resort 9000 feet above sea level, 60 miles northeast of Rawalpindi.

It was announced that Kissinger conferred in Nathiagali with General Abdul Hamid Khan, chief of staff of the Pakistan army. The announcement said the two men discussed U.S. military aid to Pakistan, curtailed after civil war broke out in East Pakistan March 25.
